

## Whakatāne Museum and Research Centre Redevelopment Fact Sheet



Project Description	The Whakatāne Museum and Research Centre Redevelopment is the second stage of Whakatāne District Council's major Arts and Culture Project, established by the Council in 2009. The first stage of the project was completed in 2012 with the opening of Te kōputu a te whanga a Toi - Whakatāne Library and Exhibition Centre. The second stage of the Arts and Culture project will see the redevelopment of the Whakatāne Museum and Research Centre, Boon Street, Whakatāne. The Redevelopment will see the existing building retained and refurbished with an extension into Burgess Park at the southern end of the building, providing a dedicated museum research centre and collection storage facility.
